Patchway Students continue their success with strong GCSE results

Congratulations to the class of 2023 at Patchway Community School who have achieved strong GCSE results, with 7-9 grades across a wide range of subjects, as well as many grade 4-9 grades in English and Maths. An impressive 42% of learners achieved 4-9 in English & Maths. This is testament to the hard work and determination of the students. All of us at Patchway Community School are thrilled that learners will be celebrating a well-deserved set of GCSE achievements.

Considering this is the first year following the pandemic, where all subjects have examined on all of the content in the GCSE specifications again, learners have coped magnificently. There has been some amazing individual performances with almost all of our students gaining what they needed, to be able to go onto either post 16 studies or apprenticeships/training. There has been some really strong outcomes, particularly in the separate Sciences, Photography, and Health & Social Care. We have also seen significant improvements in the outcomes for learners in Mathematics and Hospitality & Catering.



In addition to the excellent exam results across subjects, there have been some spectacular individual performances:

- Jacob Bevan achieved 4 grade 9's, 1 grade 8, 3 grade 7's and 1 grade 6

- Kwan Ting Chiu achieved a grade 9, 1 grade 8, 3 grade 7's, 1 grade 6 and 2 grade 5's
- Marika Sumila achieved grade 9, 1 grade 8, 3 grade 7's, 2 grade 6's and 2 grade 5's
