

Patchway Community School GCSE Results 2024

Students at Patchway Community School are celebrating some excellent GCSE results. All students should feel incredibly proud of their achievements.

We have seen a significant increase in the number of grade 9s being awarded to students and the percentage of students achieving grades 9-7 has risen compared with previous years too. The percentage of students gaining a grade 5 or better in English and Maths has improved slightly.

Outcomes for students who have Special Educational Needs and an Educational Health Care Plan have also improved.

Ivan Mo – 8 x grade 9; 1 x grade 8; 1 x grade 7 and 1 x Distinction*


Kelvin Mo – 2 x grade 9; 7 x grade 8; 1 x grade 7 and 1 x Distinction*
