Welcome from Mr Kneller, Headteacher

Term 1 of this academic year has been one of the longest terms I have experienced in 29 years of education. Whilst this has left staff and students with fatigue it has allowed us to achieve a lot.

We have continued our focus on improving the culture at Patchway in terms of having high basic expectations. Uniform has improved significantly, and the young people are now wearing their unform with more pride. Behaviour incidents and suspensions have continued to reduce, whilst attendance has seen a steady increase. Our internal monitoring systems and those of the Olympus Academy Trust are evidencing further and ongoing improvements in the quality of teaching and learning, teaching staff have spent the two INSET days receiving further training on high quality teaching techniques. All of this means we are providing an improved standard of education for our community which will enhance the life chances of the students we serve.

As is evident in this newsletter we have also been able to provide significant enrichment activities. Our recent dropdown day provided opportunities for Year 7 to visit Noah's Ark Farm to develop their work in languages, Year 8 to build on work in Religious Studies and visit several contrasting places of worship, whilst Year 9 immersed themselves in a Science day all around space and visited the National Space Museum. Year 10 and 11, in addition to receiving additional support in English and Maths, were supported with the mental health and wellbeing. A wide variety of enrichments clubs have also been offered this term and been well attended by all students.

Over half term we will be notified which contractor has secured the contract for our new build. We will work with this contractor to finalise a design over the coming months, and I will invite parents into the school next term to share initial plans and seek feedback. This is hugely exciting for our community and will provide state of the art facilities for both students and the community to learn in.

Congratulations to the class of 2024 at Patchway Community School who have achieved come excellent GCSE results. All students should feel incredibly proud if themselves.

We have seen a significant increase in the number of grade 9s being awarded to students and the percentage of students achieving grades 9-7 has risen compared with previous years too. The percentage of students gaining a grade 5 or better in English and Maths has improved slightly.

Outcomes for students who have Special Educational Needs, and an Educational Health Care Plan have also improved.

Drop Down Day

On Wednesday 16th October the school took part in our Enrichment Drop Down Day where students took part in a range of educational and enriching visits and in school activities to help support their wider personal development beyond the academic education they receive in school.

Year 7

Year 7 headed out to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm supporting their learning of the Modern Foreign Languages curriculum. Whether learning Spanish of French they furthered their knowledge of numbers, colours, animals and the rules of adjectival agreement. Despite the awful weather conditions on the day, the students completed an animal hunt and took part in animal workshop before enjoying their free time to look at the animals and play in the play area. All the students had a wonderful time.













Year 8

Year 8 had the opportunity to visit 3 places of Worship in Bristol, a Baptist Church, a Synagogue and a Mosque. The focus was on Exploring and analysing practices of the three Abrahamic faiths which students' study in KS3 and into GCSE. It was an opportunity for pupils to learn more about the diverse range of cultures in our community, as well as providing a platform for pupils to ask questions to religious believers about their experiences with faith and how it shapes their lives. Our students really enjoyed their day.













Year 9

It was an early start for our Year 9 students who visited the National Space Centre in Leicester. This trip provided an invaluable opportunity for the students to learn outside the classroom, explore real-world applications of their studies, and develop a deeper appreciation for the wonders of space. During the visit, the students had the opportunity to explore key concepts, including Earth and Space, Forces and Motion and the Properties of Materials. It was smiles all round on the students return to school.





Year 10 and Year 11

Year 10 and Year 11 stayed in school during Dropdown Day following a clasped timetable based on Mental Health, Wellbeing and Revision time. Students stayed in their tutor groups for most of the morning discussing Mental Health and 6 ways to happiness, they then had the opportunity to attend a workshop in the hall which was ran by an external professional delivering key information to support their Health and Wellbeing. After lunch students completed some crucial revision lessons in Maths and English. It was a positive day with lots of open and honest discussions around these important subjects and sharing the importance of looking after your own Mental Health as well as those around you.

Year 11 visit to UWE

40 students were able to visit UWE for the to find out more about the realities of University life. Through games and activities, they learned what the frequently used jargon means (campus? undergraduate?) and how to balance their learning, finances and wellbeing. They went on a tour around the campus where highlights included the FI car built by UWE students and, inevitably, the catering facilities. When asked, students said "they felt more inclined to aim for university than they had before they went on the trip"



Renishaw visit for Neurodiverse students

A group of 9 students from Years 10 and 11 had a fascinating morning at Renishaw, a leading engineering firm in Gloucestershire which champions a neurodiverse workforce. We had a tour (where we met an interactive Gromit programmed by Renishaw staff), took part in some talks and activities and engineered our own multicoloured torches. The feedback at the end showed that overall students felt more positive about careers in engineering and understood both the apprenticeship and university routes available.



Year 11 Mock Interview Day

We were joined by almost 40 members of the local business community for mock interview day this term. Students had worked on questions and CVs in PSHE lessons and tutor time and despite some nerves, presented themselves well. The interviewers were extremely impressed with our students' positive attitudes describing them as charismatic, open, friendly and ambitious. Well done Year 11!



Year 8 visit to University of Bristol

To celebrate its 10th birthday, the Life Sciences department invited us to bring a group of Y8 students to see the facilities and take part in lab-based activities. We identified skeletons, looked at plant samples under the microscope, assessed how clean a river is and saw how some creatures camouflage themselves in the wild. As well as being a very enjoyable experience, this was a great opportunity to visit a University and understand more about the work of scientists from the professionals themselves

General Information

Insurance

If your child brings personal items, including mobile phones, into school they must make sure they are locked away and stored safely as the Trust insurance does not cover personal items that are brought into school. We would advise not bringing valuable items to school but, if this is necessary, you will need to arrange your own insurance cover.

Bikes and scooters are brought to schools at the owner's risk. Bikes should be parked in the relevant bike sheds and locked using a secure D-type lock or similar. The schools cannot take responsibility for any damage or theft of items from the school sites and this will not be covered by the Trust insurance

Studybugs – Report absence securely and help improve children's health.

Patchway recently introduced a new, more efficient and secure system for reporting your child's absence due to illness, called 'Studybugs'. If you haven't already, please get the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child's ill and unable to attend school.
