Mobile Phones in Schools

You may have seen government guidelines regarding the use of mobile phones by young people in schools which was released in February. It can be found here: <u>Mobile phones in schools</u> <u>- February 2024 (publishing.service.gov.uk)</u>.

As the document says: "Mobile phones risk unnecessary distraction, disruption and diversion" and "by prohibiting mobile phones, schools can create safe and calm environments free from distraction so all pupils can receive the education they deserve." The guidance outlines the following possible approaches: a complete ban on bringing on site; all students handing in phones at the start of the day or locking away; or phones being in bags and turned off so they are "never used, seen or heard".

As you know, the approach at Patchway is the last of these. In light of this, it is very important that parents are not tempted to phone or text students during the day or to encourage students to use the phone to contact home. This does sometimes happen and can cause obvious conflict. If there is an urgent message that students need to receive, reception can be contacted; similarly, if your child feels unwell in any way, they should contact a member of staff or First Aid; we are in the building and so this is the best way of getting quick assistance on site if needed.
