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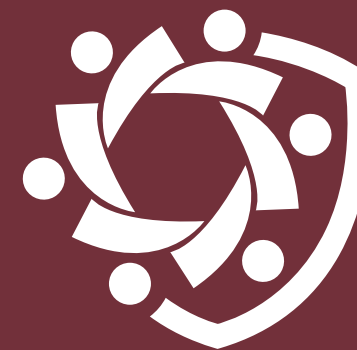

WHY CHOOSE PATCHWAY COMMUNITY SCHOOL?

Patchway Community School is a thriving secondary school where students have highly positive attitudes to their learning.

OUR NEW SCHOOL

Our new school which is being funded through the Government's School Rebuilding Programme, involves demolishing the existing school and building a highly sustainable, new secondary school on the same site, maintaining the current capacity for 1,080 pupils. The existing sports hall, playing fields and all-weather 3G pitches will be retained. Students will be able to remain on site in temporary accommodation during the phased build period.

The single new school building will replace a stretch of existing, end-of-life facilities which nestles in the centre of the site, respecting residential boundaries whilst maximising the opportunities for external play, amenity and learning spaces. The main entrance will be clearly visible from Hempton Lane to the North with the South-facing courtyard opening up to the wider site beyond.

Our new school will bring a number of benefits to the community and local area including opportunities to hire some of the school's facilities outside of school hours, such as the main hall, drama and activity spaces in addition to maintaining the current high levels of usage of the sports hall and pitches.



HOW TO APPLY

Reception and Year 7 admissions for September entry are co-ordinated by the South Gloucestershire Local Authority. Applications should be made directly to them using the details provided in the School Admissions section of their website at **www.southglos.gov.uk**.
